School Improvement Visit

This week, we had our half termly School Improvement visit from Zoe Lillitos (Primary Quality of Education Lead) and John Davie (School Improvement Consultant). This half term, they have been looking at how well we support children with Personal Development. Such brilliant feedback!

Key highlights:

- There is a very strong safeguarding culture in the school and pastoral support is provided.
- The school works well with Mindmate to support families and mental health issues.
- School has skilled staff working with a number of SEND children.

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- Pupils are familiar with protected Characteristics and are clear that discrimination including racism would not be tolerated at Micklefield.
- The school is well aware of the potential dangers that face children in the community and works hard to ensure they are equipped to deal with these.
- Behaviour in classrooms is good, and children move around school sensibly. High levels of respect are shown towards visitors.

NSPCC Number Day is celebrated annually in February and is a special day dedicated to raising funds for the NSPCC (National Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children) while having fun with numbers.

Today, children have been participating in Number challenges across school! We have still to count the remaining monies but we have raised over £100 for this great chari-
