This week our attendance figure is 93.6%

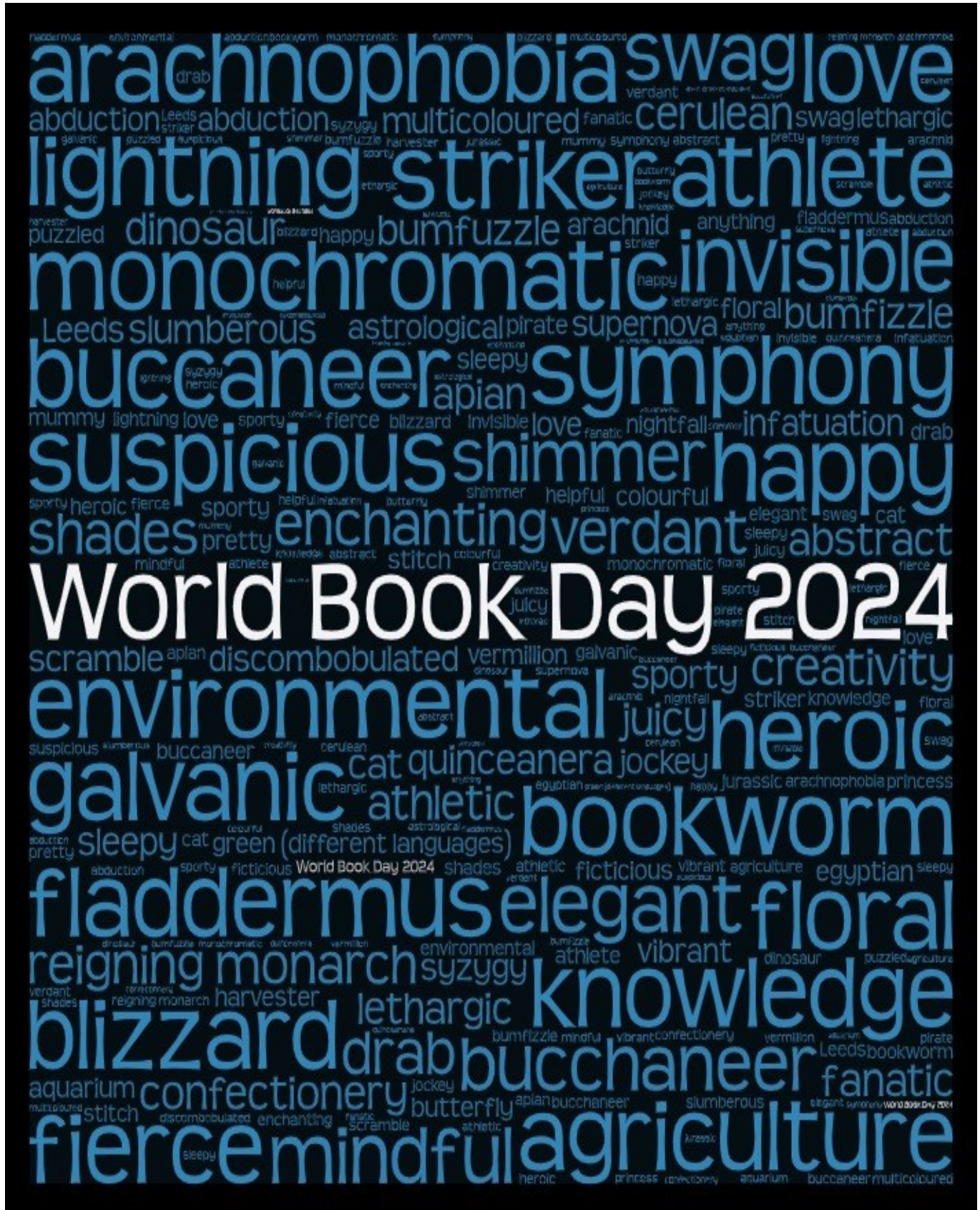
This week the number of late marks is 10
