Robins thoroughly enjoyed their Samba session with Mr Matthews this week.



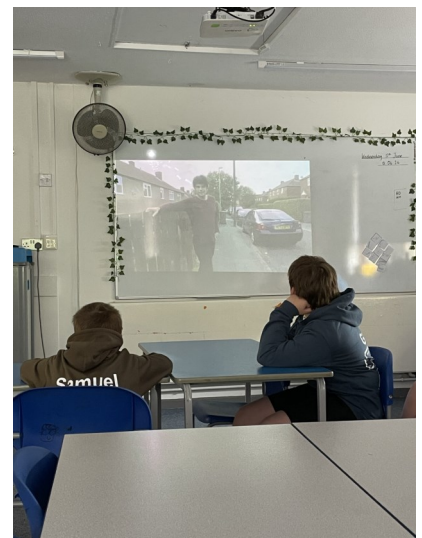
Hawks
