NSPCC

As part of our Safeguarding curriculum, the NSPCC came into school to talk to Years 2, 5 and 6. The Speak out, Stay safe programme helps children understand: abuse in all its forms and how to recognise the signs of abuse; that abuse is never a child's fault and they have the right to be safe; where to get help and the sources of help available to them, including their Childline service.



Uniform Exchange Programme

We have a new wheelie bin so that you can donate your used school uniform and find pre-loved uniform at the same time!. Clothing production has a big carbon impact. We can reduce our environmental footprint by sharing uniform so that it's worn for longer and we cut demand for new. Sharing means we can save money and help others do the same. Leeds United Foundation

Katie from Leeds United Foundation spoke to our Year 5s and 6s about the dangers both on and near the railway and to spread awareness of the far-reaching consequences of someone's decision to trespass on the railway.

The key messages to the session were:

- It is against the law to trespass on the railway and can result in a fine of £1000
- At present the trains are still running (although this may be at different times to usual so never presume you know when the next train will pass)
- The Electricity is **ALWAYS** switched on around the railway
- Always Stop, Look and Listen before using a Level Crossing

Because we have a train station and therefore a railway running through our village, it is so important for our children to understand the dangers.
